Introduction

The PE and sport premium is designed to help primary schools improve the quality of the PE and sport activities they offer their pupils. Schools receive PE and Sport Premium funding based on the number of pupils in years 1 to 6.

Our School

- Glyne Gap currently has 55 pupils in years 1-6
- We received £16,500 in PE and Sports Premium for the year academic 2024-25

How we spent the premium

The premium was used to:

- **Employ a Specialist PE Teacher (KI 1, 2, 3, 4, 5)**
- **Purchase new teaching resources to enable staff to teach PE and sport throughout the school (KI 2, 4, 5)**
- **Purchase outdoor sports equipment (KI 1, 4, 5)**
- **Host internal sports competition (KI 2, 3, 4)**
- **Facilitate school based extra-curricular opportunities (KI 1, 4, 5)**

Impact linked to Key Indicators

Spending of the Primary PE and Sports Premium is measured against the DfE 5 Key Indicators (below). Relevant Indicators are given in brackets after specific pieces of input.

KI1: the engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity and sport

KI2: the profile of PE and sport is raised across the school as a tool for whole-school improvement

KI3: increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport

KI4: offering a broader and more equal experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils

KI5: increased participation in competitive sport

Looking ahead 2025 - 2026

- We have received £14,125 in PE and Sports Premium for the year academic 2025-26. We will be using these monies to continue to:
 - Employ a Specialist PE teacher (LS Coaching)
 - Purchase sports equipment for use on school premises
 - Facilitate school based extra-curricular opportunities
 - Host internal sports competition

Desired Impact on PE and Sport participation and Attainment

Impact on participation and attainment is evaluated on an individual basis through pupils' IEP targets for Physical Development, which incorporates PE and Sports targets. The judgments are made by the class teacher/ Specialist PE teacher.
