# PE and Sports Premium at Glyne Gap School – 2022/23

### Introduction

The PE and sport premium is designed to help primary schools improve the quality of the PE and sport activities they offer their pupils. Schools receive PE and Sport Premium funding based on the number of pupils in years 1 to 6.

### Our School

- Glyne Gap currently has 46 pupils in years 1-6
- We received £16,500 in PE and Sports Premium for the year academic 2022-23

# How we spent the premium

#### The premium was used to:

- Employ a Specialist PE and Sports Teaching Assistant £19.000 p.a.
- Purchase new teaching resources to enable staff to teach PE and sport throughout the school
- Pay costs to enable pupils to access sports activities off-site
- Develop opportunities for in-school sports provision, enhancing school facilities by the creation of a new Multi Use Games Area (MUGA).
- Develop the opportunities for in-school sports provision, enhancing school facilities by development of covered area on playground to enable access to outdoor sports activity in all weathers.

## Desired Impact on PE and Sport participation and Attainment

Impact on participation and attainment will be evaluated on an individual basis through the pupils' IEP targets for Physical Development, which incorporates PE and Sports targets. The judgments will be made by the class teacher in consultation with the Specialist PE and Sports Teaching Assistant.

### Impact linked to Key Indicators

Spending of the Primary PE and Sports Premium can be measured against the DfE 5 Key Indicators (below). Relevant Indicators are given in brackets after specific pieces of input.

KI1: the engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity

KI2: the profile of PE and sport is raised across the school as a tool for whole-school improvement

KI3: increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport

KI4: broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils

KI5: increased participation in competitive sport

- Development of Multi Use Games Area (MUGA) (KI 1, 2, 4)
- Development of covered outdoor sports area (KI 1,2,3)
- Resources Outdoor Sports equipment purchased for use in new areas (KI 1, 4, 5)
- Brighton and Hove County Cricket Coaching (KI 1, 2, 3, 4, 5)
- A group of Senior pupils took part in the Parallel Youth Games, playing Boccia, goal ball and parachute games. (KI 1, 2, 3, 4, 5)
- Junior and Senior classes were able to access the local gym to experience using different equipment from what is available to them in school and begin to access community opportunities to support their sensory regulation and fitness for the future (KI 1, 4)
- Junior and Senior classes were able to access the local swimming pool to experience community opportunities to support their sensory regulation and fitness for the future (KI1, 4)
- PMLD classes were able to experience specialist Yoga sessions to meet their unique need (KI 1,3,4)
